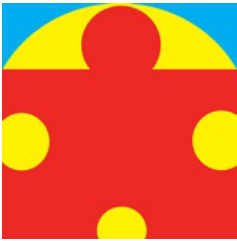

Eligibility for the Flying Point Foundation for Autism requires those who apply to have demonstrated a commitment to our success. This can take the form of:

In addition, all applicants must obtain a letter of recommendation from a guidance counselor or other school professional who knows them well.

The deadline for receipt of applications and supporting documents is April 15. Plan accordingly.
